Stop Hitting & Yelling: Teach Dogs the Right Way

Humane, science based training that actually sticks

The Big Idea

- Hitting & yelling don't teach—they create fear & confusion.
- Fear blocks learning—brains in survival don't think well.
- Rewards work—pay the behavior you want so it repeats.

What Works: Manage \rightarrow Teach \rightarrow Reinforce

- Manage: Prevent mistakes (gates, leash, clear counters).
- **Teach:** Show what to do (sit, mat, look at you).
- Reinforce: Tiny treats, play, life rewards.

Why Force Backfires

- Fear of people & hands; more anxiety.
- Shut■down or defensive snaps later.
- No new skill learned—just suppression.

Jumping on Guests (Mini■Plan)

- Manage: Leash before door opens; have treats ready.
- **Teach:** Ask for *sit*, mark "yes," pay sit.
- Reinforce: Paws down → greet; jumping → turn away, reset sit.
- Practice brief reps; add new people slowly.

Loose■Leash Walking (Mini■Plan)

- Use a front■clip harness.
- Tight leash → stop; slack or eye contact → say "yes," move, reward at your leg.
- Short sessions (5–10 min), add distractions later.

When to Get a Pro

- Look for CCPDT, IAABC, Fear Free, or a DACVB.
- Good pros use rewards, management, humane plans.
